## Pharma Fights Rule for Price Disclosure in Ads

**BIOTECH:** Amgen joins coalition in legal action.

Last month, Amgen Inc., Merck & Co., Eli Lilly Co. and the Association of National Advertisers filed a lawsuit to stop a new federal regulation requiring the disclosure of the list price for prescription drugs in television advertisements.

The lawsuit was filed in federal court in Washington, D.C. against the Trump administration, which introduced a new regulation through the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services that would require pharmaceutical companies to disclose a drug's list price, or wholesale acquisition cost, in advertisements.

The regulation is set to take effect this month. It's part of the government's efforts to bring down drug costs for consumers.
